TAEKWON-DO HISTORY

I began my training story under the instruction of Mr. Sam Clark (3rd Degree ITF Taekwon-Do) in 1989. I was encouraged to join the Papatoetoe Dojang by my younger brother Harley. At this time, we were affiliated to the ITF (International Taekwon-Do Federation) via Grandmaster Young Ku Yun based in Australia. I joined at a time of turmoil and which eventually led us to become independent. This was a major turning point for our organisation and one that turned out to be positive and beneficial to all involved. We now were directly recognised by the ITF and our Founder General Choi Hong Hi. We also created strong connections with the USTF and made many lasting friendships that have stood the test of time. We became known as ITFNZ (International Taekwon-Do Foundation of NZ) and later rebranded to ITKD in July 2010 (International Taekwon-Do).

I spent many years under the tutelage of Mr. Clark and learned at a great pace with many wonderful friends, many of whom I still regularly train with today. During 1993 - 1994, Mr. Clark stepped away with family commitments and while at the University of Auckland I took over the Dojang - one of the oldest and most established ITF schools in New Zealand. So at the age of 22, I took control of the hall keys and riding my ten speed bike, I rode three times a week through summer heat and winter rain to keep our Dojang afloat. In 2023, we celebrate our 40th Birthday and the amazing connection we have with the local community! I am extremely proud of all we have accomplished with the most recent being six members of the club in the New Zealand Team for the World Championships in Inzell, Germany in 2019. I continue on my learning journey with ITKD and enjoy greatly being able to contribute at all levels.

Background

Of Ngāti Whakaue and Irish descent, my parents were Robin John Raukura and Robyn Mary Raukura. I attended school at Saint Joseph's Primary Otahuhu and then De La Salle College Mangere in Auckland from 1985 - 1991. In 1991 I was the College Captain. In 1989 I began my training in ITF Taekwon-Do and since then the Martial Arts have been an integral part of my life. The moral culture of Taekwon-Do, our tenets and the student oath have shaped my personal philosophy, belief system, relationships, communication and life outlook. My core friendship base is contained within my Taekwon-Do family and it is through my training and position that I find a large part of my personal identity. I am currently employed as the foundation Deputy Principal of Saint Ignatius of Loyola Catholic College in Drury, Auckland.

Special qualities, skills, or achievements

In 2004, 2006, 2008, 2020, 2021 my club, 'Dragon's Spirit' Taekwon-Do Papatoetoe was voted as the National Club of the Year. 2004 saw myself successfully gain National Instructor of the Year. I have also received nominations and been shortlisted for this award in 2012 and 2021. I am recognised as an instructor who is loyal and a true guarantor of our Founders legacy. As a person who actively lives out our tenets, my integrity and mana have meant that I have held many trusted positions within our organisation, including the Director of Standards and Discipline for New Zealand. This was a role I held for over ten years and saw me safe guard all we stand for and deal with scenarios that involved multiple external agencies. I have also sat as a Director on our National Board, authored the 'Child Protection Policy' for our organisation and began our 'Stand Up for Kids' Annual Child Protection Awareness Month. On the 26th July 2014 I received my plaque for 25 years of dedication and service to Taekwon-Do in New Zealand and in July of 2015 I was made a 'Life Member' of our organisation (ITFNZ / ITKD).



Through my example and clear expectations of my students, Dragon's Spirit Taekwon-Do has actively and positively served the local community for over 27 years. At this stage in my martial career I have personally created over 128 Black Belts and high performance athletes that have represented New Zealand at the World Championships and World Cup on numerous occasions. So even though I consider us a 'grassroots' family club, we achieve at the highest level. I have not heard a single story of any of my Black Belts (past or present) who have not had larger success in life and have not become their very best selves.

Technical ability in your chosen art

I have been a Regional Examiner within ITKD for the last 10 years and have recently been appointed as the newest Senior Examiner nationally. I personally have not competed for many years and this is an aspect that I find minor compared to the greater intricacies of our art and why we do what we do. That said though, I support and encourage all forms of competition to those that are interested. In that regard, I am a respected judge, umpire and regularly take a head jurors position at our regional and national tournaments. I love Taekwon-Do and what we do, I have a particular leaning towards breaking, tul (kata) and self defense, but consider all aspects beautiful in their own way.



Current Grade and Title


My current rank is 7th Degree Black Belt (7th Dan). Promotion date : 8th March 2020.
